


Town of Gilford New Hampshire Floodplain Map

A floodplain is any land area that is susceptible to flooding, generally located in low-lying areas adjacent to rivers and lakes. It is easy for any stream or river to overflow their banks & spill onto the adjoining land area, causing a floodplain. It is important to identify floodplains for the safety of the community. Loss of life & property damage can result when people build in floodplains.

Those areas that are not Zone A or Zone AE are Zone X locations. These areas are known as areas determined to be outside 500-year floodplain.

Note: The data portrayed on this map is a rough estimate based off of FEMA panels of Gilford, NH, dated May 1992. The shape, size, and location of the floodplain data may have changed. This map should be updated once the panels are updated.
