2015 Report of the Police Department Subcommittee

The subcommittee of the Gilford Budget Committee assigned to review and make recommendations regarding the budget proposal for the Gilford Police Department met on October 19, 2015, commencing at 3 PM in Conference Room A of the Gilford Town Hall.

Subcommittee members Norman J. Silber & Sue Greene were in attendance. Attending to represent the Police Department were Chief Anthony Bean Burpee and Lt. Kristian J. Kelley.

Each line item in the proposed budget was carefully reviewed and discussed at length.

The line item for full time wages, for a full complement of 18 officers, as significantly cut by the BOS, is expected to be very "tight." At present, the Department is at 17 officers and is in the process of attempting to fill its one vacancy. The salary ranges and benefits are at levels believed to be competitive for comparably sized departments. The payroll taxes and benefit charges are essentially outside the Town's control and are based on federal laws and state retirement plan requirements.

The line items on page 25 are essentially flat with the prior year budget, except for 2 that decline by less than \$200 and one that increases by \$100.

The Guardian Tracking Program noted in Software Licensing & Support is an HR program to keep track on a continuous basis of performance reviews of all personnel.

The ammunition for firearms re-qualification is used on a semi-annual basis rather than every 2 years.

On page 26, vehicle fuel costs have been figured at the State's price of \$2.59 per gallon, but the actual cost to the department is expected to be less.

The equipment & supplies figure would be adjusted downward if the requested TASER/body camera program (as discussed later in this memo) is approved.

On page 27, the building maintenance is expected to include stripping and re-waxing the floors of the new departmental facilities twice a year rather than every 2 years. The Town has discussed contracting out the regular janitorial services for the expanded departmental facilities.

The last entry on page 27 is for the first year payment to provide for all new TASERS and body cameras for all patrol personnel. The Tasers would be replaced automatically every 5 years and the cameras every 2.5 years- there would also be a number of backup units on site to cover for those that go down in use before they can be repaired. The Chief played a very short video that

demonstrated the superiority of the views provided by the body cameras as compared to dash cameras in the patrol cars, and he intends to ask for an opportunity to show the short clip to the entire committee as part of his presentation.

On page 28, the motor vehicle line item has been cut by the BOS and consists of a motorcycle lease and 2 new SUV's as part of the rolling replacement program. Lt. Kelley has undertaken to repair many of the older light bars to be able to keep them in service longer, and the DPW does the oil changes and minor maintenance on department vehicles.

The 7 pages at the back of the PD tab in the Budget Workbooks deal with the details of the TASER/body camera program. NH police agencies currently utilizing TASER's body cameras and Evidence.com services:

The proposed TASER/body cam program appears to be highly impressive, should serve to reduce any liability claims against the department and/or town, and appears to be tried and true and reasonably priced.

We then toured the new and renovated Police Department facilities, which were quite impressive, although there is still some minor finishing work to be completed.

The Department intends to seek a grant to install a training (shoot/don't shoot) simulator in one of the available areas in the new building which appears to be of adequate size.

Computers in patrol cars, along with the associated equipment, are expensive at this time, and there is some concern that if they are in the cars the officers will lose some situational awareness when they are "glued" to the screens, either writing reports or typing in inquiries about vehicles and persons. The present system which utilizes our 24/7/365 dispatcher(s) in the communications center is believed to meet our present needs for such checks. We were advised that automatic license plate readers are prohibited in New Hampshire.

The new building has a kitchen/break room but no money in the budget for appliances to furnish it. So Chief Burpee and Lt, Kelley found someone on Craig's List who was moving and selling a stainless refrigerator, stove, hood, and dishwasher and they purchased all of them for the Town for a grand total of \$400, picked them up and brought then back to Gilford and were able to obtain the plumbing contractor for the overall project to hook up the DW without additional charge. Very well done!!!

The subcommittee unanimously recommended approval of the BOS proposed budget for the Police Dept. totaling \$2,661,688.

The subcommittee meeting adjourned at 5:30 PM.

IMPORTANCE OF BODY WORN CAMERAS (BWCs)

- A growing number of law enforcement agencies are adopting BWCs in order to document interactions during police-suspect encounters, at crime and incident scenes, and during traffic stops.
- Law enforcement agencies have found BWCs to be useful for officers in the favorable resolution of both administrative and criminal complaints and as a defense resource in cases of civil liability.
- BWCs provide a clearly documented, firsthand, objective account of what was said and what occurred during incidents in question.
- BWCs can provide investigators, prosecutors, and juries with far more detailed, accurate, and compelling evidence.
- Experience has shown that BWCs have a positive influence on the behavior of officers themselves; therefore, promoting accountability and serving as an important training aid.

BWC INFORMATION

- \$2.5 billion dollars is paid out annually in settlements due to complaints alone.
- Many companies offer law enforcement camera technology so settling on a particular company to do business with can be daunting.
- Such decisions, however, cannot be made based on "up-front costs alone" as doing so results in decision-makers missing the big and expensive picture.

LET'S LOOK AT THE MATH

- Current BWC research estimates that officers equipped w/ cameras will record between
 6-9 videos/10-hour shift. GPD officers work 12-hour shifts, so estimating 10 videos/shift is feasible.
- 12 officers w/ cameras working rotating schedules = (approx.) 150 videos/week.
- 150 videos x 52 weeks = 7,800 videos per year.
- A 1-terabyte server stores (approx.) 3,200 videos.
- 3 1-terabyte servers would be needed for 3,200 videos.
- 3 1-terabyte servers x (approx.) \$350.00 each = \$1,050.00/year for storage.
- Approx. 30 minutes of each shift would be spent by officers to upload 10 videos.
- 30 minutes is (approx.) 4% of a 12-hour shift.
- \$60,000.00/year x 4% = \$2,400.00/officer.
- $$2,400.00 \times 12 \text{ officers} = $28,800.00/\text{year in lost productivity}.$
- Videos need to go somewhere for storage, which means having an IT process in place for access, retention, searching, organizing, and auditing (to include detectives & the Prosecutor for evidence-related cases, as well as Command Staff for Administrative/I.A. investigations).
- Conservatively figure \$10.00/request for hard-costs & personnel for searching, recording to disks (an additional expense), and transporting.
- A 10% request of the 7,800 yearly videos = \$780.00/year in annual sharing costs.

- \$28,800.00 (lost productivity) + \$1,050.00 (storage) + \$780.00 (sharing costs) = \$30,630.00/year in related costs.
- Purchasing a camera system that automates the entire process is the most cost effective.
- TASER offers cameras with docking stations that automatically upload videos to Evidence.com; a digital evidence locker securely encrypted twice over that immediately makes information available for file management and sharing.
- As a result, GPD will not have to deal with any manual processes or associated costs.
- Utilizing TASER's products and storage solution for 12 officers = \$950.00/officer/year.
- 12 officers x \$950.00 = \$11,400.00 as a yearly cost savings.
- \$30,630.00 (lost productivity/storage/sharing costs) \$11,400.00 (TASER cost savings) = \$19,230.00/year in overall savings.

Here is the TASER quote for both the brand new TASERs (every five years) and body cameras (every $2\frac{1}{2}$ years) to include all required equipment.

I did call TASER and found out that you can pay for the first five years up front. The difference between using the TASER TAP program and stretching the payments out as opposed to getting a loan is saving on interest as there is none built in with TASER.

Once year #5 ends, we would then sign a new five year TAP contract with TASER in order to remain in the program. The cost of the Officer Safety Plan "may" increase slightly in year #6 but would remain the same for years 6-10 for budgeting purposes. Every five years a new TAP contract can be signed.
