As meetings continue to be scheduled, other members of the Chief's administrative staff will join him in attending.

"Bringing Gilford's diverse citizens together with police personnel only serves to improve community relations," Chief Bean Burpee states. Community policing can be characterized as the process by which to create proactive problem-solving solutions in order to address possible conflicts surrounding a range of issues. One such way to assist in mitigating the impact of such conflicts regarding public satisfaction is to allow for open dialogue, to all possible extents, so that citizens can gather helpful information, as well as for the Chief to discuss police goals, priorities, and resources. Crime trends, safety considerations, and other police related topics will also be discussed.
